I give and bequeath appoint and dispose of all my leasehold lands mesonages and hereditaments goods chassels monies securities for money debts and personal estate and effects whatsoever whether in profession or expectancy or whatever my interest therein may be of into which I shall be possessed or entitled at the time of my decease including therein any sum or sums of money or personal property which I have power to raise or appoint and dispose of by this my Will unto my said son Thomas Wharton his executors administrations and assigns as his and their absolute property. And I appoint my said son Thomas Wharton Executor of this my Will In witness whereof I the said Thomas Wharton the Elder have hereunto set my hand this twenty fith day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight \_\_\_\_\_ the mark X of Thomas Wharton the Elder as his Will in the presence of us present at the same time and who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses \_\_\_\_\_ The mark of X Thomas Hughes \_\_\_\_\_ Henry M Taylor clerk to Thomas and Wharton Solicitors Manchester.

Prove on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November 1859 by the oath of Thomas Wharton the son of the Testator the sole Executor.
